Plano experiences
20-25 nights and
5-10 days each year when temperatures fall below freezing.

POWS provides a safe and secure overnight sleeping environment to assist those in greatest need.

If the City of Plano calls a weather emergency, we will open during the day as well as night.

What is a warming station?

A warming station is an overnight short-term emergency shelter that operates when temperatures or a combination of precipitation, wind and temperature become dangerously inclement. The main purpose is the prevention of death or injury from exposure to the elements. The Salvation Army of Plano and East Plano Islamic Center (EPIC) serve as warming stations for our unhoused neighbors in Plano, TX. The Plano Overnight Warming Station (POWS) seeks to:

- Provide transportation from Parker Road DART station and the POWS facility
- Serve meals, snacks, and hospitality in a secure environment
- Provide support services to address recurring homelessness issues
- Recruit and train faith communities and other volunteers to staff the POWS facility

Ways to volunteer

<u>Clothes closet</u>: Volunteers set up the closet and supervise guests as they pick out clothes on event nights.

<u>Transportation</u>: Volunteers transport guests on shuttle buses between Parker Road DART station and the warming station.

<u>Hospitality</u>: Volunteers serve in various capacities. They register guests as they enter the warming station, secure guest belongings, hand out bedding, provide basic medical supplies, serve meals, or stay overnight.

<u>Showers</u>: Volunteers monitor the showers so the guests can enjoy a hot shower.

Weather communications:

Monitor the forecasted weather conditions and post forecasted temperatures on the POWS website. Communicate with all stakeholders to coordinate opening of the warming station when weather conditions criterions are met.
